

Fertility: Assumptions regarding fertility have no effect on the number of women in these ages. Mortality: Life expectancy at birth for women was assumed to increase from 65 years in 1976 to 68years in 1985.

Migration: Net international migration was assumed to be nil during the projection period.

Source: Total and age-specific fertility rates for 1970 for Peninsular Malaysia were derived using registered births, by age of mother, adjusted for 3.5 percent underregistration, and the estimated midyear population, by age and sex (see table 3 and the Technical Notes in the appendix).

The 1970 rates for East Maiaysia were derived by the Brass technique for estimating fertility (Brass, et al., 1958), using children-ever-horn data from the 1970 census of Sarawak, and registered births by age of mother for Sarawak. Rates derived for Sarawak were also accepted for Sabah (see the Technical Notes in the appendix for further discussion),

The 1970 and 1976 total and age-specific fertility rates for total Malaysia are based on registered births, by age of mother, adjusted for 7 percent underregistration, and the estimated midyear population, by age and sex. The estimate of underregistration of births in Malaysia in 1970 is based on the adjusted births for Peninsular Malaysia and the births for East Malaysia implied by the estimated age-specific fertility rates and the estimated midyear population. Births in 1976 were assumed to be underregistered by the same percent as was estimated for 1970. See the Technical Notes in the appendix for further discussion.

The gross reproduction rates were based on the total fertility rates and the sex ratio at birth.

Net reproduction rates were calculated using the age-specific fertility rates, the sex ratios at birth, and  $L_{\rm N}$  values for females. Female  $L_X$  values for Peninsular Malaysia are shown in table 5. Female  $L_X$  values for East Malaysia were derived using estimated life expectancy at birth and Coale-Demeny west region model life tables (see section on mortality in the Technical Notes in the appendix). The 1970  $L_X$  values for total Malaysia are shown in appendix table A-7. Female  $L_X$  values for 1975 were derived using total adjusted deaths (see table 3 and the Technical Notes in the appendix) and the 1970 pattern of mortality.

The sex ratios at birth were based on registered births for 1966 to 1976 for Peninsular Malaysia (United Nations, 1976, table 23; and Malaysia DOS, 1978b, table 11.00).
