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Reconstruction of Fertility Trends for the Female Population of the U. S. S .R.

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On the other extreme, the group over 40 years of age shows drastic alterations in the shape of its fertility pattern. High rates in this age group are frequently associated with the rural type of society where women continue childbearing to a high age. In the case of the U.S.S.R. the relative contribution of women aged over 40 to the total fertility was several times lower in the 1960's than in the late 1920's, thus suggesting a decrease in the proportion of the rural population as a possible explanation of the trend.
